From the Pastor

The “Yes’s” and “No’s” of Love

Our behavior does not always represent our God. When this happens, what does God do? Look the other way? Pretend sin isn’t there? Minimize it, and say it’s no big deal? Play the passive or the avoidant, and sweep sin underneath a lumpy rug? When our actions or attitude is ungodly, God speaks. This is love. God’s love can be seen in God’s correction. The discipline and “no’s” of God equally point to His love for us just as much as anything else. God says “no” because God loves us.

Discipline is different from punishment. God does not punish us. The wrath meant for us was laid upon Jesus at the cross. For those who call Jesus friend and Lord punishment ended at the cross. "He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree" (1 Peter 2:24). Christ paid for our wrongdoing.

Discipline and punishment have a different relationship to time. Punishment looks back. It focuses on making payment for wrongs done in the past. For example, Christ's death was payment for our sins. Discipline, however, looks forward. The lessons we learn from discipline helps us to not make the same mistakes again: "God disciplines us for our good, that we may share in his holiness" (Hebrews 12:10).

How does that help us? It frees us to make mistakes without fear of judgment, without fear of loss of relationship: "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus" (Romans 8:1). Romans 8:1 suggests to us isolation and judgment will not be the result when Christians sin. However, do be sure, there are consequences when we sin. Sin costs us intimacy with God among other things.

Yes's and no's just don't come from God. Yes's and no's come from other humans too. They too, can come out of love. Think of the following as examples: the no of parents, the no of siblings, the no of teachers, the no of friends, the no of bosses and supervisors, the no of spouses, the no of health problems from overeating, alcoholism, or an irresponsible lifestyle, the no of police, court, and prison.

Some people learn to accept and respect “no” from parents. Other people need law enforcement to intervene and enforce a “no” that was not learned earlier in life. Proverbs 19:27 says, “Stop listening to instruction, my son, and you will stray from the words of knowledge.” Whether the instruction is from God, or the instruction is from other humans, understand the “no” can be said out of love.

The last thing any human needs is to be surrounded by friends who nod their heads like bobblehead dolls to everything they say or do. What kind of true friend is that? It may stroke the ego, but it doesn't help grow and mature. We need friends who love us enough to say “no,” and seek out a way to lovingly disagree with us to our face. We need friends to help
