## VBS 2015 Volunteer Meeting Tuesday, January 6, 6:30-7:30pm.

At the August governing body meeting, we evaluated VBS 2014, and charted a new course to pursue for VBS 2015.

### Below is the direction WCBC will take for VBS 2015:

#### A) **Involve the parent(s).**

What happens to a child's growth in the Christian faith after VBS is over? Is discipleship continued by the parent(s) in the home after a child attends VBS for one week? The short answer to this question is, "we don't know." Producing lifelong followers of God is our mission. Therefore, instead of an intense burst of child only discipleship, we will ask parent(s) to attend VBS with their child. VBS 2015 will be family oriented. Although we can never be assured discipleship is continued after VBS ends, we do know that building a relationship and equipping the parents for discipleship in the home is immensely valuable in building lifelong disciples, and should not be overlooked in our VBS philosophy.

#### B) **Not every night.**

VBS 2014 was a tightly packed Sunday through Thursday schedule, 5:30-8:00pm in the evenings. What structural model provides us the best chance children will think about Christianity throughout the entire summer? It was decided a stretched out series of dates, a weekly or bi-weekly model, instead of an everyday compact model is worth trying.

#### C) **Length each night.**

VBS 2014 was 2.5 hours each night for the children. Often, more than 2.5 hours were asked of adult volunteers, some of whom hold jobs of 50+ hours a week. Therefore, this prompted us to ask a series of questions related to the attention span of children, along with what is healthy to ask of adult volunteers that we want to see maintain a healthy work/rest balance. VBS 2015 will last 1.5 hours each night.

#### D) **Three elements.**

How will we break down the 1.5 hours we are with the students and parents? There will be three elements: meal time, Bible time, and activity time. Each will last approximately thirty minutes.

#### E) **Financial support.**

What amount of financial backing is respectful and appropriate to ask of our congregation to support VBS? Our goal is to raise an offering of \$200 to cover expenses.
